

A feasibility study by Grimm + Parker Architects created a master plan for the entire campus which is comprised of Edgewood High School, Edgewood Middle School, and Deerfield Elementary School. These schools share access, parking, electrical service, water/sewer services, and playfields. The Board of Education approved the master plan to include the replacement of both Edgewood High School, and Deerfield Elementary School.

Because of the proximity of the structures and the shared resources, it is evident that the campus needs to be looked at as a whole to keep operations in place during construction, and to make the overall campus an improved space with three schools on separate services.

The master plan provides improved traffic circulation and separation of car and bus traffic. High school drivers are separated from elementary and middle school traffic. Each school has a clear identity and entrance point. Playfields and entry areas are visible and easy to supervise. Competition fields are at the rear of site to buffer the community from light and noise.

Construction phasing will be accomplished by separating the rear of the campus and accessing it from the existing Broadneck Crossing entrance. The Bus lot will be used for staging and contractor parking.

Design has begun on both schools with a target schedule that includes a spring 2008 construction start.
