• Ring Factory Elementary students in Bel Air are learning real-life business and financial lessons from a Junior Achievement program being delivered from the kindergarten through 5th grade. Ring Factory classroom teachers, volunteer parents, and community volunteers joined Freedom Federal Credit Union employees to dedicate their time to a 5-session class, designed particularly for each grade and age level. This is the ninth year that Ring Factory has participated in the in-class portion of the Junior Achievement (JA) program, but this is only the second year that every grade participated during the same year. • Harford Youth Tobacco Use is Down - The recent Department of Health and Mental Hygiene survey polled 82,500 students in Maryland on areas related to cigarette smoking, secondhand smoke, and related topics. The survey is done every two years and data can be compared to results from previous surveys. In Harford, all middle and high schools (with the exception of the Alternative Education Center) were sampled.

Results were very encouraging for Harford County's progress in decreasing the number of young people involved with tobacco use compared to the survey two years earlier. Harford County was one of two counties which saw a reduction in the initiation of tobacco use by under-age youth. The 32 percent reduction was the



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highest in the state. Harford County was third in the state for significant declines in tobacco use among under-age youth with a 38 percent reduction. The county also showed significant declines in the percentage of under-age youth who smoked cigarettes in the past 30 days (down 48 percent). Out of 40 categories surveyed, Harford County showed decreased rates greater than the state rate in 34 of those categories. Harford students surveyed reflected significant declines in 22 of those categories. For more information, contact Don Morrison at 410-588-5203.

- The Maryland Association for Environmental and Outdoor Education (MAEOE) will honor 36 schools as new "Maryland Green Schools". This year, Aberdeen High School will join the ranks of other schools in Maryland, becoming a Green School for the first time. In a three year effort by a dedicated group of students that call themselves the "Green Team", this vision was realized following an extensive application process and documentation through MAEOE. The Maryland Green School program recognizes and supports public and private schools that use their campus and the local environment as a place to learn, model environmental best management practices and work with community partners to enhance learning and stewardship.
