

SGT Sanchez is a 17-year veteran of the Harford County Sheriff's Office.


He began his career in Patrol and worked in the Warrant/Fugitive Unit and as a Supervisor in School Police (SRO).

The HOPE house is designed as a mock teenager's bedroom, there are more then 50 areas in the display where drugs are hidden.



Pledge Program

- HCSO Community Police Unit, in partnership with the Office of Drug Control Policy began the program in Spring of 2019
 - ➤ 11 programs, over 300 elementary School students completed and received their PLEDGE certificate
 - > Drug Refusal skills, how to deal with peer pressure, why drugs and alcohol are very dangerous to young minds

CORE Program





- ➤ Unveiled August of 2022
 - > 19 events, over 700 teenagers used the technology
- ➤ Partnership between Aberdeen Providing Ground Federal Credit Union (APGFCU), Harford County Sheriff's Office and Harford County Sheriff's Foundation.
 - > \$120,000 donated by APGFCU to the Foundation
 - > \$50,000 in asset forfeiture funds
- ➤ Interactive learning exhibiting featuring touchscreen video technology. Students see alternate endings and positive outcomes were different choices are made to demonstrate options.
