

AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

Championship Awards.

An award will be presented to the high school declared the Harford County or UCBAC champion of a tournament or a varsity sport. To qualify as a champion of a sport, a team must have played a bona fide schedule, that is, a specified number of games played against all other county and/or conference public high schools according to the officially approved schedule.

School Awards.

Student athletic awards will acknowledge the participant's contribution to his or her school team.

- a. The first award earned will be the approved school athletic "letter," including the appropriate emblem.
- b. For awards for subsequent years and subsequent sports, participants will receive the appropriate stars, pins, or similar school-related insignias.
- c. During the first year of participation on a varsity team, a letter will be awarded on the basis of points scored, time played, or other similar criteria.
- d. By the second year, participants in all varsity sports who meet all of the rules and guidelines pertaining to team membership will earn a school letter regardless of points scored, time played, or other school-adopted criteria.
- e. All junior varsity team members will receive certificates of participation.
- f. Coaches and/or schools will determine the degree of participation necessary in order for a manager, scorekeeper, trainer, or statistician to receive an award.
- g. All members of a team, players and managers, are eligible to earn the Minds in Motion Award if they have a 3.25 G.P.A.
- h. In order to receive an athletic award, an athlete must complete the season in good standing and have met all team obligations.

All-Star Games. Individual students may participate in all-star games per sport upon the completion of their eligibility in the sport in which this participation occurs.
