BOARD OF EDUCATION TO HOLD ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSIONS ON FY15BUDGET

Members of the Board of Education will host two roundtable discussions to provide an opportunity for community leaders in Harford County and the Harford County delegation to meet with them to discuss the budget development process and to provide input on the development of the FY15 school system operating budget. Additional topics for discussion at the legislative roundtable will include unfunded mandates and the state aid wealth formula. The community leaders meeting will be held tonight at Edgewood High School from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. The legislative meeting will be held Wednesday, December 4, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the A.A. Roberty Building. Both meetings are open to the public; however, neither agenda includes an opportunity for general public comment.

Each year, HCPS sends five students to Annapolis to spend two, non-consecutive weeks serving in either the House of Delegates or the Maryland Senate, performing various tasks such as filing books, running errands and sitting in on meetings and hearings. The competitive selection process for the Student Page Program, which began months ago, starts with each public and private school in the county choosing up to two applicants. Selected students completed an application and participated in a grueling interview process where they appeared before a 12-person committee made up of students and educators from around the county. From this pool of students, an ultimate five pages and one alternate are selected, which mirrors Harford County's representation in Annapolis. The high school seniors who were chosen to serve as student pages for the 2014 Maryland General Assembly Karly Horn, John Carroll; Natalie Hutcheson, C. Milton Wright; Kennan Kros, Edgewood High; Jeffrey Mason, North Harford High; Rebecca Parrish, Edgewood High (alternate); and Kelly Stifler, John Carroll – will come together on Thursday, December 5, 2013, from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. for a breakfast event at Aberdeen High School. During the breakfast, the pages will have the opportunity to meet with the elected officials for whom they will support in the upcoming 90-day legislative session to take place January through April 2014.

Ethics Panel members serve for a term of five years, appointed at staggered intervals. Members are appointed by the Board of Education and may serve two full terms. Ethics Panel members serve without compensation but are reimbursed for travel and other expenses related to their service.
