FEV VIRTUAL SUMMER ACADEMY (VIRTUAL) GRADES 3-8*

FEV Tutor has partnered with Harford County Public Schools to provide an enriching academic journey for your students this summer. FEV Tutor's Virtual Summer Academy is designed to assist students in bridging learning gaps and developing essential skills across various grade levels, ensuring they are well-prepared for the upcoming school year.

Virtual Summer Academy Plan Options:

Acceleration Plan: Offered to grade levels 3-8 to introduce standards for the upcoming grade level.

Reteaching Plan: Offered to grade levels 3-8 to revisit recent grade level standards to progress towards proficiency.

Sessions will begin on Monday, July 1, 2024, and end on August 9, 2024.

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (IN-PERSON)

The High School Summer Learning Program provides high school students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to complete a four-week credit recovery program. Students are expected to participate in daily in-person sessions and independently work on course content throughout until all required course content is complete. Classes begin Monday, July 1 and end Thursday, July 25, 2024, and will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 7:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

Physical Education (PE) courses and Geometry will be offered for credit recovery and original credit. Original Credit geometry will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 7:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. (with no afternoon transportation). Wellness Walking will be the only course offered in a virtual format this year.

Transportation will not be provided.
