GENERAL POSITIONS

- Support continued governance autonomy for local boards of education to set education policy and school budgets.
- Support full state and federal funding for Maryland's outstanding public schools.
- Support robust state funding for school construction and renovation projects.
- Oppose any and all unfunded and underfunded state and federal mandates.
- Oppose legislation to mandate expanded special education services beyond federal requirements.

OVERARCHING THEMES

LOCAL BOARD GOVERNANCE
