IN THE FIELD

Wendy Anderson, M.Ed. Associate Superintendent Academics and Leadership Archdiocese of Washington

Wendy Anderson spoke to The Danielson Group about deepening the connection of the Framework for Teaching to their faith-based school community.

In a process that involved the voices of a number of stakeholders, the Archdiocese of Washington added faith-based elements to extend the ways in which the Framework illustrates their values. "We didn't take anything away. We carefully added ways to reflect our values that aligned with the research-based components of the Framework."

The committee was careful to think about how teachers would provide evidence. "If teachers wouldn't be able to provide clear evidence that we could discuss for the purpose of growth, then we didn't include the element," explained Wendy Anderson. For instance, the concept of a "prayerful life" was considered as an addition. But the group realized this aspect was more like a Common Theme, prayerfulness permeates the work of a teacher in many domains. But "daily prayer," and a "sacred space" in the classroom were among the elements included in the modified rubrics.

Giving more context to the Framework was supported by training for observers who participated in walk-throughs with a Danielson Group Advisor and providing resources and collaboration days with teachers. The observation system was differentiated for new and experienced teachers. "We found our community had strengths in building relationships with students," noted Wendy Anderson. "Our work was to build on those strengths to take instruction to the next level, moving along a continuum of excellence."
