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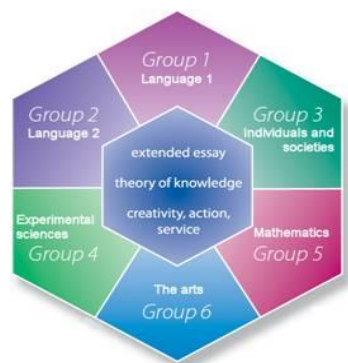

The CORE IB Components

- ◆ **Extended Essay**- In- depth research paper completed on a topic of student interest and choice
- ◆ **CAS**- reflective process focused on the areas of Creativity, Activity, and Service
- ◆ **TOK**- Theory of Knowledge, a critical thinking course that inquires into the ways in which we think and learn
- ◆ Note- students in the IB Program would find it extremely difficult at pursuing a dual enrollment option with HCC



Global Studies Program

- During grades 9 and 10 students enroll in GS (Global Studies) and AP (Advanced Placement) courses that are infused with IB skills, ideologies, and practice IB assessments.
- Students have the opportunity to network with an upperclassmen Peer Helper.
