The Second Annual Celebration of Excellence in Education was held on April 9, 2024, at Mountain Christian Church in Joppa. The surprise announcements were made in front of nearly 500 invited guests from all over the county, including school system leaders, administrators, and staff; former and current educators; students; family members and friends; elected officials; and community sponsors.

The evening celebrated everyone who impacts the education of HCPS students. The event began with the induction of Terri Wainwright into the HCPS Educator Hall of Fame. Ms. Wainwright worked for nearly twenty-seven years at HCPS from 1977-1980, then again from 1988-2012 as an English Teacher and a Secondary Mentor Teacher.
