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# Medicare Retiree Health Strategy: Study Conducted

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## **Harford County Public Entities (HCPE) Consortium commissioned study for:**

- Group Medicare Advantage with Part D (Group MAPD) to replace current Medicare retiree health coverage
- Potential cost of coverage, and annual savings, for HCPE Consortium members and Medicare retirees

## **Schools and Government concluded Group MAPD viable option to pursue and bid:**

- Customized group Medicare Advantage plan with Part D Rx coverage for HCPS members
- National, passive Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) plan; In/Out of Network benefits are the same

## Comparison: Current Plans to Group MAPD Plan

Current Group Plans	Group Medicare Advantage with Part D Rx (MAPD)
Existing group plans	Customized HCPS-sponsored plan
Existing benefits (coinsurance, copays)	Same or enhanced benefits (copays)
No savings in retiree premium, nor HCPS costs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ~34% HCPS annual savings*</li> <li>• ~\$28 reduction in retiree monthly premium compared to Traditional plan*</li> </ul>
Self-insured	Fully insured
Customer service supports both employees and retirees	Customer service focuses exclusively on Medicare retirees

## Comparison: Current Plans to Group MAPD Plan

<b>Current Group Plans</b>	<b>Group Medicare Advantage with Part D Rx (MAPD)</b>
Different plans, depending on location, but no choice	One plan design for all retirees
Current providers available	Current providers who continue to accept Medicare, nationwide
Plans pay secondary to Medicare - complex	All benefits under one plan – easier to understand
Mandatory mail order / CVS pharmacies for maintenance drugs	No restrictions on pharmacy access
Mandatory generics	No mandatory generics
Existing communication process unchanged	Includes extensive communications

## Illustrative Member Savings: Current Plan vs. Group MAPD

Annual savings over current Traditional Supplement Plan: Chronic and Healthy member

- HCPS estimated savings for group MAPD ~\$1,700 per person per year

	Chronic User		Healthy User	
	Current Traditional	Group MAPD	Current Traditional	Group MAPD
Cost of Coverage	\$7,600	\$5,200	\$6,600	\$4,300
HCPS Subsidy	\$5,400	\$3,700	\$5,400	\$3,700
Net Cost to Member	\$2,200	\$1,500	\$1,200	\$600
Savings to Member	N/A	\$700	N/A	\$600

**Notes:**

Cost of Coverage equals premium (or equivalent) plus Estimated Out-of-Pocket Costs for Services / Prescriptions

HCPS subsidy equal to total cost of current plan or group MAPD 2020 illustrative rate minus 10% retiree premium



# Medicare Retiree Health – Wrap up

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## Key Takeaways:

- Cost share features that result in similar or lower out-of-pocket costs for members
- Members can continue to use their Medicare providers
- Current retiree contribution percentages continue to apply to group MAPD premium
- Savings to Medicare Retiree Members and to HCPS

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## **Actions to this point:**

- Briefing with leadership from unions and Benefits Advisory Committee
- Meeting with retiree leaders and select Board members to design group MAPD plan

## Medicare Retiree Health – Timeline continued

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### Moving forward:

- November - February: Develop Request for Proposal
- February: Request for Proposal released in open bid
- March – May: Evaluation of Proposals
- May: Open Enrollment for Short Plan Year
- June – July: Negotiations of Contract with Finalist
- **July: Contract Approval by Consortium and BOE**
- August – December: Communication with Members
- October: Open Enrollment
- January 1, 2021: Effective Date for New Group MAPD Plan
