**RECOMMENDATION ON
USE OF EQUIPMENT/MATERIALS BY STUDENTS
POLICY NO. 02-0050-000**

Background Information:

The Board maintains a manual which sets forth the various policies of the Harford County Public Schools (“HCPS”). The manual contains policies which are either required by federal and state law and regulation or which are, in the Board’s judgment, necessary and appropriate in order for the school system to operate in a lawful, appropriate, and effective manner. Included among such policies is that entitled:

02-0050-000 Use of Equipment/Materials by Students

Discussion:

The policy entitled 02-0050-000 Use of Equipment/Materials by Students, was adopted by the Board at its June 14, 2010, Board Business Meeting. This policy sets forth criteria regarding student use of equipment and materials off school premises, that a student shall use reasonable and ordinary care when using equipment and materials off school premises, and that the school principal may obtain restitution as permitted by law when equipment or material is damaged off school property as a result of a student’s negligence or intentional act.

Proposed revisions to this policy have been made to address a student’s use of equipment and materials on school premises. The reason for this proposed change is the near systemwide student use, on school premises, of electronic devices provided to them by HCPS. The proposed revisions to this policy set forth the same standards of care and recourse for restitution regarding on school premises use as currently set forth for off school premises use.

Superintendent’s Recommendation:

For the foregoing reasons, the Superintendent recommends that the Board review for approval at a subsequent Board meeting the proposed revisions to policy 02-0050-000 entitled Use of Equipment/Materials by Students.

In the event school equipment or material in the possession of, or used by, a student, on or off school property, is damaged or destroyed as a result of the student's negligence or intentional act, the principal of the student's school may obtain restitution or reimbursement, as permitted by law, with respect to such damage or destruction and, when appropriate, may impose disciplinary sanctions.
