July 18, 2022

Background Information:

The <u>Rules, Regulations, and Procedures for the Administration of the Public School Construction Program</u> require each local education agency (LEA) to annually submit its school system's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to the state and local governments.

Discussion:

This is the first presentation of the FY 2024 CIP. This presentation is meant to assist the Board of Education in understanding the current CIP funding process and requirements. Additionally, this presentation will discuss the potential impacts of the <u>Built to Learn Act</u> and the <u>State Facility Assessment</u> to the Harford County Public Schools FY 2024 CIP request.

In September, we will ask the Board of Education to approve the FY 2024 State CIP budget for submission to the Interagency Commission, the State funding authority for public school construction projects.

Between now and January, we will continue to work with the Board of Education and stakeholders to prioritize the FY 2024 local only CIP needs and align the request with our operating budget. In January, we will ask the Board of Education to approve the FY 2024 CIP for submission to the local government.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

The Superintendent of Schools recommends that the Board of Education accept this informational report and presentation of the FY 2024 Capital Improvement Program.



Funding Sources

State Funding

- Major Renovation / Systemic Projects
- Facility Age: Minimum of 16 years since last funding
- \$200,000 Minimum for Systemic Request
- Enrollments & Capacities
- Sustainable Communities
- Local participation Cost Share

Local Funding

- One major project at a time
- Limited support of locally funded projects
 - Facility Repairs
 - Technology
 - Academic Needs
 - Life Safety and Security
 - Cost of Doing Business /
 Maintenance and Upkeep






Prioritizing CIP Needs – Decision Matrix

FY 2024 CIP Budget Impacts

Reallocation Operating Savings

- Address some local only funded priorities
- Annual maintenance and upkeep

State Healthy Schools

- Changed submission timeline
- Used Capital Balance transfers to fund local match
- Limited request to available match

State Safety Grant for Facility Improvements

- No local match requirement
- Amount not yet announced

State Assessment

- Completed Statewide
- Facility Condition Index (FCI) rating
- Currently revisiting schools for additional assessments

State Built to Learn Act

- Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA)
- \$35,685,000 (not guaranteed)
- IAC requirements
- Local Match Required

- Homestead / Wakefield Elementary School Replacement Funding source


