- ▶ A brief presentation where you present a profile of your selected artist and connections to the class using the characteristics of a strong speaking voice- projection, enunciation, and vocal variety.





It was 1983. I was ten years old. MTV was EVERYTHING. We didn't have to stay up until midnight for Friday Night Videos or set our VCRs to record our favorite music videos anymore: MTV was a MUSIC VIDEO CHANNEL. And it played music videos ALL the time.

For a young girl, like me, in a small town in almost West Virginia- this was a window to the bigger world! And Cyndi Lauper was my HERO!

THEN.... in 1984- my FAVORITE AUNT JEANNIE surprised me with tickets to see The Bangles and Cyndi Lauper at Fairmont State, West Virginia- my first concert ever- and my favorite person for company. I still remember that night. And I wore my "She Bop" Cyndi Lauper - She Bop (Official HD Video) - Bing video sweatshirt proudly in the halls of the 6th grade after.

For a young, impressionable girl living in a sheltered, small, man's world- seeing Cyndi Lauper sing about having fun and dying her hair, dancing in the streets, and rebelling against society's prescribed roles to be herself -unapologetically- was a huge inspiration. Her lyrics and gorgeous voice an anthem of what a girl could be.

"Time After Time" Cyndi Lauper - Time After Time (Official HD Video) - Bing video is an all time favorite. For me- then and now- it was about my aunt and I and how close we are- and that memory of my first concert ever. Only later, did I realize that it's really a breakup song!! HA!

And "True Colors" is an anthem for the ages. Then and now.

I was so excited to see many years later that she was writing the score for a musical: Kinky Boots- that went on to win a Tony for best original score!!

To this day I love Cyndi Lauper. Her lyrics, her voice, her music, her advocacy, what she meant to me then and what she still means to me today! — Mrs. Green

- ❑ Known for her Queens, New York accent, wild hair that changes colors often; her offbeat fashion sense, high pitched, distinctive voice, and active support of Women's and Gay rights.
- ❑ Her most successful songs are "Girls Just Want to Have Fun" (1983, #2 US and UK), "Time After Time" (1984, #1 US, #2 UK), "She Bop" (1984, #3 US), "All Through The Night" (1984, #6 US), "True Colors" (1986, #1 US), "Change of Heart" (1986, #3 US) and "I Drove All Night" (1989, #6 US, #7 UK).
- ❑ She was awarded a Tony Award for Best Score in a Musical for *Kinky Boots* at the 2013 Tony Awards.
- ❑ Known for her **FOUR OCTAVE** vocal range. She toured with The Bangles, Debbie Harry, in 1997 with Tina Turner, and 1999 with Cher.
- ❑ She was awarded a Grammy Award for Best New Artist at the 1985 Grammy Awards.

One of the most intriguing mysteries of the 20th century is: What happened to Amelia Earhart? She was born in 1897. She was the first woman to fly across the Atlantic ocean. In June 1937 she and her copilot, Lieutenant Commander Fred J. Noonan, left Miami, Florida on an around-the-world flight attempt in a twin-engine Lockheed aircraft. On July 2 the plane vanished near Howland Island in the South Pacific. The world waited with fascination as search teams from the United States Army and Navy, along with the Japanese navy, converged on the scene. She was never found.

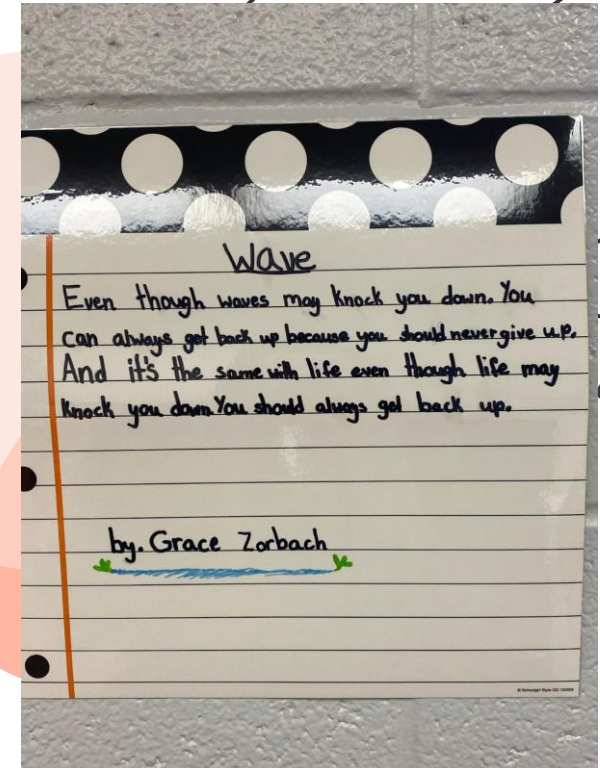
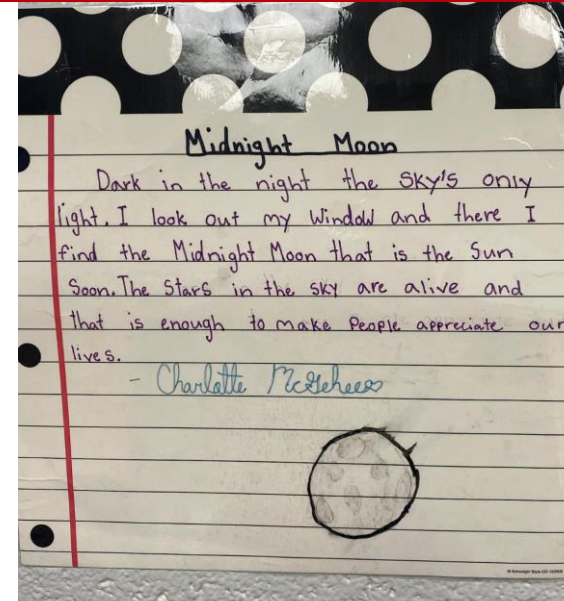
