POLICY, PROCEDURE MANUAL CATEGORY STUDENTS				

I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to set forth the Board's commitment to educating students who are homeless in accordance with federal and state law and regulation.

II. **Definitions**

- A. <u>Homeless student</u> means:
 - 1. A child or youth who lacks a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime place of residence.
 - 2. Children and youth who arc sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason, are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations, are living in emergency or transitional shelters, also referred to as transitional housing, are abandoned in hospitals, or arc awaiting foster care placement.
 - 3. Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for individuals.
 - 4. Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.
 - 5. Migratory children, as defined in §6399 of Title 20, who qualify as homeless for the purposes of the McKinney-Vento Act.
- B. <u>McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act of 1987</u> ("McKinney-Vento Act") means: Federal law codified at 42 United States Code§ 11431 *et seq*.

III. Statement of Policy

A. The Board affirms its commitment to provide educational services and supports to homeless students in accordance with the McKinney-Vento Act; Code of

Maryland Administrative Regulations ("COMAR") 13A.05.09 and any other pertinent law.

- B. In furtherance of the above commitment the Board directs the Superintendent to:
 - I. Appoint a coordinator for the education of the homeless who shall ensure that homeless students are identified and served in accordance with the McKinney-Vento Act; COMAR 1 3A.05.09, and any other pertinent law or regulation.
 - 2. Adopt procedures to implement this policy.
