

Balancing Enrollment Community Surveys - Executive Summary

In January and February of 2021, Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) collected feedback on balancing enrollment through a phone survey and an online survey. The phone survey targeted a statistical representation of parents/guardians throughout the county, totaling 656 surveys. The online survey was open to parents/guardians, students, district staff, and community members and had 4,049 responses. Of those 4,049 responses, 3,570 were parents/guardians, 479 were students, 306 were employed by HCPS, 161 were residents of Harford County, 4 had a development or real estate interest in Harford County, 1 was a business owner in Harford County, and 1 planned to move to Harford County.

The phone and online surveys had several of the same questions. Below is a comparison of the responses to these questions overall, for each of the regions assessed in balancing enrollment process, and for elementary, middle and high schools. The schools within each assessment region are listed below. **Note**: The regions summarized in the Critical Data phone survey summary document are more general than the regions below.
