



WELCOME TO HARFORD GLEN!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We invite your child to spend three days and two nights with us at Harford Glen. Harford Glen creates an inclusive learning environment for all students. It will be our privilege to teach your child about the world that we live in and the opportunities we all share to practice environmental stewardship every day. The Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) Fifth Grade Residential Outdoor Education Program has been in existence since 1980 and is known throughout the State of Maryland for its history of excellence and environmental leadership.

Your child will be immersed in environmental field experiences that enhance the fifth grade Environmental Stewardship curriculum. The Harford Glen environmental educators are highly qualified former classroom teachers who are employed by HCPS. All lessons highlight environmental literacy objectives and are aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards. In addition to curricular instruction, your child will discover a sense of teamwork, self-reliance, and appreciation of nature in a residential setting.



OPEN HOUSE:

If you are new to the Harford Glen program, we invite you to attend an open house. The dining hall, lodges, and classrooms will be open so you can see where your child will be living and learning. The open house dates and details are listed in this handbook. They are also posted on the HCPS website, www.hcps.org/harfordglen.

Feel free to bring your child with you, but understand that you will be responsible for your child's whereabouts and behavior while on site. If you are unable to attend an Open House, watch the Virtual Open House on YouTube.

FEES, MEALS, AND SNACKS:

During your student's stay, Harford Glen provides all meals and snacks starting with lunch on day one and ending with lunch on day three. See the menu in this handbook or the interactive menu online at www.hcpsmenus.com. The meal program is run by HCPS Department of Food and Nutrition Services so your student will see familiar foods. Meal costs are the only fee associated with this field experience and are applied directly to the student's account for two breakfasts and three lunches based on current school meal prices and the price your student normally must pay

at their school. HCPS covers the cost of your student's dinners and snacks. Be sure to add funds to the meal account!

Students may not bring outside food to Harford Glen. If your school participates in the Universal Free Breakfast Program or the Community Eligibility Provision, these programs will also be in effect while the students are at Harford Glen.

To ensure that students with medical diet accommodation needs are met, the Harford Glen Special Medical Diet Accommodation Form must be completed. Contact your school nurse for this form. In most cases, the medical documentation provided to the school provides enough information for the Harford Glen staff to meet students' needs. Occasionally more medical information may be required. See the Allergy Notice section for more information.

ATTENDANCE:

Since this is a residential program, students should remain at Harford Glen throughout the session. Lodging is established for students using their gender or gender identity. The Harford Glen staff is well trained and experienced in helping children through homesickness and you will be notified if a serious case develops.

While present, students are expected to honor the school's behavioral expectations as all HCPS rules and policies apply. If you decide that your child should not participate in any portion of this program, you are required to communicate early dismissal plans with your child's classroom teacher via email.

MEDICATIONS AND FORMS:

Each student participating in the program is required to complete the **Consent for Administration of Approved Discretionary Medications & Health Contact Information Form**, which must be signed by the parent or legal guardian. This document includes authorization for the student to receive discretionary medications if the Harford Glen nurse deems it necessary.

Children who have medications and medication permission forms on file at school **do not need** additional forms completed by their physician. As with any field trip, the school nurse will make copies of the school medication permission form and will send it with the medication to Harford Glen.

If your child needs to take <u>additional prescription or non-prescription</u> (over-the-counter) <u>medication or doses</u> while at Harford Glen, other than those on file at school, a <u>Medication Policy and Permission Form</u> for <u>each medication</u> must be completed. The form is found at the end of this document.

 The Medication Policy and Permission Form must be signed by an authorized prescriber and signed by the parent/legal guardian.



- Only the needed doses of medication for the time spent at Harford Glen should be sent.
- Please send only the medications that are necessary.
- School Nurses cannot accept expired medication.
- Forms and medications should be turned in to the School Nurse at least **one week** before the Harford Glen trip.
- NO medications or Medication Policy and Permission Forms can be accepted on the morning of departure.
- The Harford Glen nurse may not give over-the-counter NON-FDA APPROVED medications, even with a signed Medication Policy and Permission Form. This includes Melatonin.
- Lunchtime or mid-day medications will not be given on the day of departure.
- Students may not transport or have any medication in their possession. If you need help transporting the medication to school, please reach out to your school nurse or administrator for assistance.

ALLERGY NOTICE:

Harford Glen is an outdoor facility with a Dining Hall, so allergens may be present on the property. Please be very thorough when describing your child's allergies and accommodations required on the Health Contact Information Form. The school nurse's office conducts annual anaphylaxis awareness training for staff and maintains a shared updated list of students and staff with severe allergies. Families that have questions or concerns about allergies at Harford Glen are directed to speak to the Harford Glen nurse prior to your child's residential outdoor education experience.

Medical documentation for special diet accommodations must be on file at school. Please contact the school nurse for **Harford Glen Special Medical Diet Accommodation Form** to specify and coordinate the student's individual plan.

TRANSPORTATION:

If your child is participating in the full overnight program:

- Complete the electronic MSForm or Family Contact Information Paper to communicate transportation plans for your student.
- Arrange to have your child driven to school on the first morning of the program.
- The class will meet at school, board a bus, and ride together to Harford Glen.
- Buses will leave Harford Glen at noon (10:45 on Early Dismissal Days) on the last day of the session and return to school for pickup.

• Arrange to have your child picked up from school on the last day of the program.

If your child is not participating in the overnight portion of the program, but will be with us all day:

- Students will ride the bus on the first and last day with their class.
- Parents are responsible for transportation on the first night, second day and third morning.
- Email your child's teacher to let them know the pickup and drop off plan.

If you need to pick your child up for an appointment and will drop them back off the same day at Harford Glen:

- Fill out the electronic MSForm or Early Dismissal Form in the Paper Packet
- Email your child's teacher to let them know the pickup and drop off plan.

PACKING GUIDELINES:

Harford Glen has adopted monitoring and packing guidelines to reduce the likelihood that pests are carried to and from our site.

- All Harford Glen buildings are continuously monitored for pests.
- All participants, including teachers, high school counselor volunteers, and fifth grade students, will pack their belongings in no more than two 13-gallon kitchen trash bags, clearly labeled with the person's name on the outside of the bags. Suitcases and duffel bags are prohibited.
- Packing Guidelines
- Upon arrival at Harford Glen, participants will unpack their bags into a clear storage box.
- Backpacks will not be allowed in the lodges. They will safely remain in the Dining Hall.
- If you suspect or have experienced pest problems in your home, contact the school nurse for guidance so appropriate measures can be taken to eliminate them from your child's belongings before the Harford Glen field trip. All communications will be strictly confidential.
- Commercial clothes dryers will be used to heat student belongings for thirty minutes at 120°F-150°F if pests are found or suspected in or around their possessions. Parents will be contacted if this protocol is deemed necessary.

COUNSELORS:

An appropriate number of teachers and staff members will provide supervision for the group during the trip. Every session, students from the public high schools in Harford County volunteer as counselors for the residential outdoor education program. These students are recommended by teachers, guidance counselors, and administrators in their schools and are excused from class for the duration of the session. Many of these high school students plan

to pursue a career in education or the environment upon graduation. Counselors are held to the highest standards of behavior and citizenship while participating in Harford Glen programs.

If you know a high school student in grades ten, eleven or twelve that would be interested in the opportunity to volunteer as a counselor at Harford Glen, direct them to learn more about the program on the Harford Glen website, www.hcps.org/harfordglen.

VALUABLES:

All personal property sent to Harford Glen is the responsibility of your child. It is best if your child leaves all valuables at home, including cellular phones and Smartwatches. One of the goals of this unique program is to allow children to disconnect from electronics and daily routines so they may focus on the natural world and the people sharing this experience together.

HCPS policy states, "Students in elementary school may possess a portable communication device (PCD) or personal learning device (PLD) on school grounds during the regular school day provided they are kept and maintained in the student's backpack or cubby and is deactivated." If you choose to send a cellular phone or Smartwatch with your child, it will remain off and in your child's backpack for the duration of the program. To protect the privacy of all participants, any device capable of taking photographs is prohibited in the lodges and restrooms.

HARFORD GLEN MERCHANDISE:

The Harford Glen Foundation is a non-profit organization that supports environmental education programs in our county. If you would like to purchase Harford Glen merchanside (t-shirts, hats, ect), the proceeds directly benefit Harford Glen and the students in Harford County Public Schools. - The main gate will open automatically at the designated start time.
- This is a self-guided event with Harford Glen teachers available to answer questions. Stay for as long or as little as you like.
- Please allow 30 minutes for your visit- all sessions will conclude promptly at the designated time. The gate will close 15 minutes prior to the end of the session.
- Start your visit in the Dining Hall to sign-in and view the specific packing requirements for the residential program.
- You will have the opportunity to explore the Dining Hall, Lodges, Classrooms, and property on your own.
- If you would like to explore the Harford Glen grounds, the property will be open to the public from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays through October 30 and again in the spring beginning April 1. HOW TO REACH HARFORD GLEN





DIRECTIONS

From Route 24, turn west onto Wheel Road (the light for Wheel Road is next to the Festival Shopping Center), go straight through the traffic circle at Tollgate Road and continue until Wheel Road reaches a dead end at the Harford Glen gate. The distance from Route 24 to the gate is about one mile.

If the main gate on Wheel Road is closed when you arrive, please use the call box at the gate to notify the staff that you have arrived. The automated gate will be opened and will immediately close behind you. Follow the signs to visitor parking and make the first left, right before the yellow gate, to park in the lot next to the Dining Hall.



RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

DELAY ON FIRST DAY OF PROGRAM:

If HCPS delays the opening of school on the first day of the program, the Harford Glen Program will also be delayed the same amount of time.

- For example, if HCPS delays opening of schools for two hours, the bus will pick up the fifth grade students at school at 11:15 a.m. (or 11:45 a.m. for fourth tier schools).
- High school volunteer counselors should arrive at 10:00 a.m.

CANCELLATION ON FIRST DAY OF PROGRAM:

If HCPS cancels school on the first day of the program, the Harford Glen program will also be cancelled for that day. Whenever schools open the following day, whether it is on time or a delayed opening, busses will arrive to pick up the fifth grade students. If it is a delayed opening, see above.

High school volunteer counselors should report to Harford Glen whenever school opens.

CANCELLATION ON FIRST AND SECOND DAY OF PROGRAM:

If HCPS cancels school on the first and second day of the program the entire session will be cancelled, and make-up dates will be scheduled for later in the school year.

THREAT OF INCLEMENT WEATHER DURING PROGRAM:

If severe weather is forecast during your session, the Harford Glen staff will consult with the elementary school administrators and the Transportation Division of HCPS to determine whether your students will remain at Harford Glen, if the session will be modified, or if the session will be postponed and every attempt will be made to schedule make up dates at the end of the school year.

The HCPS automated telephone messaging system will be used to notify parents/guardians if inclement weather changes the Harford Glen schedule. Ensure that all emergency contact phone numbers are up to date and the number provided is one where a parent/guardian can be reached at any time of day or night during your child's visit to Harford Glen.

EARLY DISMISSAL FROM HARFORD GLEN


INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

The procedures below are in place to maintain a safe, secure learning environment for all.

- Students who are not participating in the overnight portion of the program should be picked up at 8:00 p.m. on day one and two. Students should arrive at Harford Glen at 7:45 a.m. on days two and three. Breakfast begins between 7:45 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and will be available to students who did not spend the night.
- For safety and security purposes, the gate will not open between 7:30-8:00 p.m. Guardians will need to wait outside the gate for the 8:00 p.m. pick up time. The gate will not open prior to 7:45 a.m. Please wait with your student outside the gate until 7:45 a.m.
- Email your child's classroom teacher and let them know your pickup and drop off arrangements.
 - · Include the date(s) and time(s) of pickup and drop off.
 - · Include the name and cell phone number of the person picking up your child.
- Harford Glen is located at 502 West Wheel Road, Bel Air, Maryland 21015. If the driver is going to be delayed, Harford Glen should be notified at 410-638-3903.
- Harford Glen is closed to the public on all school days, so all visitors must stop at the call box located on the left side of the road at the main gate. Once the button is pushed on the call box, a Harford Glen staff member will answer the call, ask the driver to identify themselves, and then open the gate.
- If the driver approaches the gate and another automobile is driving in or out of the property, they must still stop at the call box and speak to a Harford Glen staff member before entering the property. This will ensure the safety and security of all visitors to Harford Glen.
- Once admitted onto the Harford Glen property, the driver must follow the parking signs and park in the visitor's lot. Follow the signs to the Nurse's Office. They must show a valid driver's license to the Harford Glen staff member for identification. The child will be brought to the Nurse's Office for dismissal. Do not enter other rooms, buildings, or pavilions.
- Parents and guardians are responsible for insuring that all drivers are aware of these guidelines.

HARFORD COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS MEDICATION POLICY AND PERMISSION FORM

It is the policy of Harford County Public Schools to prohibit students from possessing or using prescription/over-the-counter medication on school buses or on school property. Note: a student may <u>NOT</u> carry pills, capsules, or liquid medication at any time.

- The medication and completed Medication Policy and Permission Form must be brought to the health suite by a parent/guardian or responsible adult. Students are not permitted to carry medication on school buses or on school grounds. Under extenuating circumstances, there may be exceptions. This is for the safety of all students.
- Prescription medications must be in a labeled prescription container with specific instructions that match the following order.
- Over the counter medications must be in the original container.
- A new form is needed each new school year and for all changes in medication, dose, or time.
- All medication not picked up by the last day of school will be destroyed.

HEALTH CARE PROVIDER INSTRUCTIONS FOR GIVING MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

On the reverse side of this letter is a consent form for the administration of certain nonprescription/over-the- counter medications which will be available, at no charge, for all students at Harford Glen. This service is available to alleviate your student's minor discomforts and to avoid early dismissals from the Residential Outdoor Education Program. These medications are approved by the Harford County Health Department and the Supervisor of Health Services for Harford County Public Schools. This service helps our students improve attendance and enhance academic performance. Please note that there will be no cough drops provided this year. You may signify your permission to have your student self-carry cough drops from home by checking the appropriate box.

Your consent must be obtained before any medication is given to your student. Only the Registered Nurse/Licensed Practical Nurse at Harford Glen may administer these medications in accordance with established protocols. The consent form lists the medications which may be available. Please complete the consent form and return it to your child's teacher at least one week before the Harford Glen session. The consent is only in effect for your child's Harford Glen session.

Approved discretionary medications are intended for occasional use only. Discretionary medication will be administered at the **discretion of the Harford Glen nurse**. If your student requires any prescription or nonprescription medication on a regular basis, you must obtain a written order from your health care provider and supply the medications.
