#### ITALIAN-AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Italian American Heritage Month, celebrated in October, honors the contributions of Italian immigrants and their descendants to U.S. culture and history.
- Italian Americans have enriched American cuisine, arts, and politics, with notable figures like Frank Sinatra, Enrico Fermi, and Antonin Scalia.

The month coincides with Columbus Day, which commemorates the explorer's voyage and highlights Italian American heritage.

#### POLISH-AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- The month is to commemorate the arrival of the first Polish settlers in Jamestown, VA in October 1608 as well as the death of Casimir Pulaski, the father of American cavalry.
- First celebrated by the Polish American Cultural Center in Philadelphia in 1981 under the leadership of the Center's President, Michael Blichasz.
- Polish American Heritage Month is now recognized nationally by the President and Congress.

#### **BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH**

Breast Cancer Awareness Month aims to increase awareness of breast cancer, support those affected, and promote early detection through screenings. The month also highlights the importance of research and funding for improved treatments.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women worldwide, with 1 in 8
 U.S. women being diagnosed in their lifetime.

 Early detection through regular mammograms can reduce the risk of dying from breast cancer by 25-30% for women aged 40 and older.

 Men can also be diagnosed with breast cancer, though it is much rarer accounting for less than 1% of cases.
