HCPS is seeking educators to teach in the 2022 Stars of Summer program! Stars of Summer is a virtual, camplike summer school experience for rising grade one through grade nine students. We need your ingenuity and creativity to provide students with another exciting summer experience. Please read on to learn more about this paid teaching opportunity.

Grades 1-9: Stars of Summer

For rising first through ninth grade students, we will provide a unique camp-like exploration of engaging workshops created by HCPS educators. This is a wonderful opportunity for educators to develop and offer workshops given unique interests and talents, with all content areas eligible to participate. Counselors, psychologists, librarians, specialists, and other similar positions are also eligible. Here is a sampling of workshop ideas: improv and acting, birding, gaming, mindset, cooking, music production, digital photography, coding, engineering design, forensics, technology skill development, the science of movies, social justice, book clubs, wellness, and artful journaling. The list goes on and on!

Stars of Summer will run in one-week blocks between July 18 and August 4 (Monday through Thursday only).

Week 1: July 18 – July 21 Week 2: July 25 – July 28 Week 3: August 1 – August 4

Teachers may choose to offer workshops for as many weeks as one would like. Teachers may also choose how long each workshop will meet each day, ranging from one to three hours. There is great flexibility in overall workshop design given the nature of the content that is chosen.

Additional Information:

- Workshops are intended to be vibrant and fun, designed with grade bands in mind: rising 1-2, 3-5, and 6-9.
- Workshops will be synchronous/live, with asynchronous opportunities built in as needed.
- Class sizes will be limited to approximately twenty-five students.
- Course proposals will be reviewed and approved by a team of HCPS educators prior to being offered to students.

- Help our students remain engaged in unique learning during the summer.
- Develop additional technical skills related to online teaching and learning.
- Opportunity to gain experience with Canvas prior to the next academic year.
