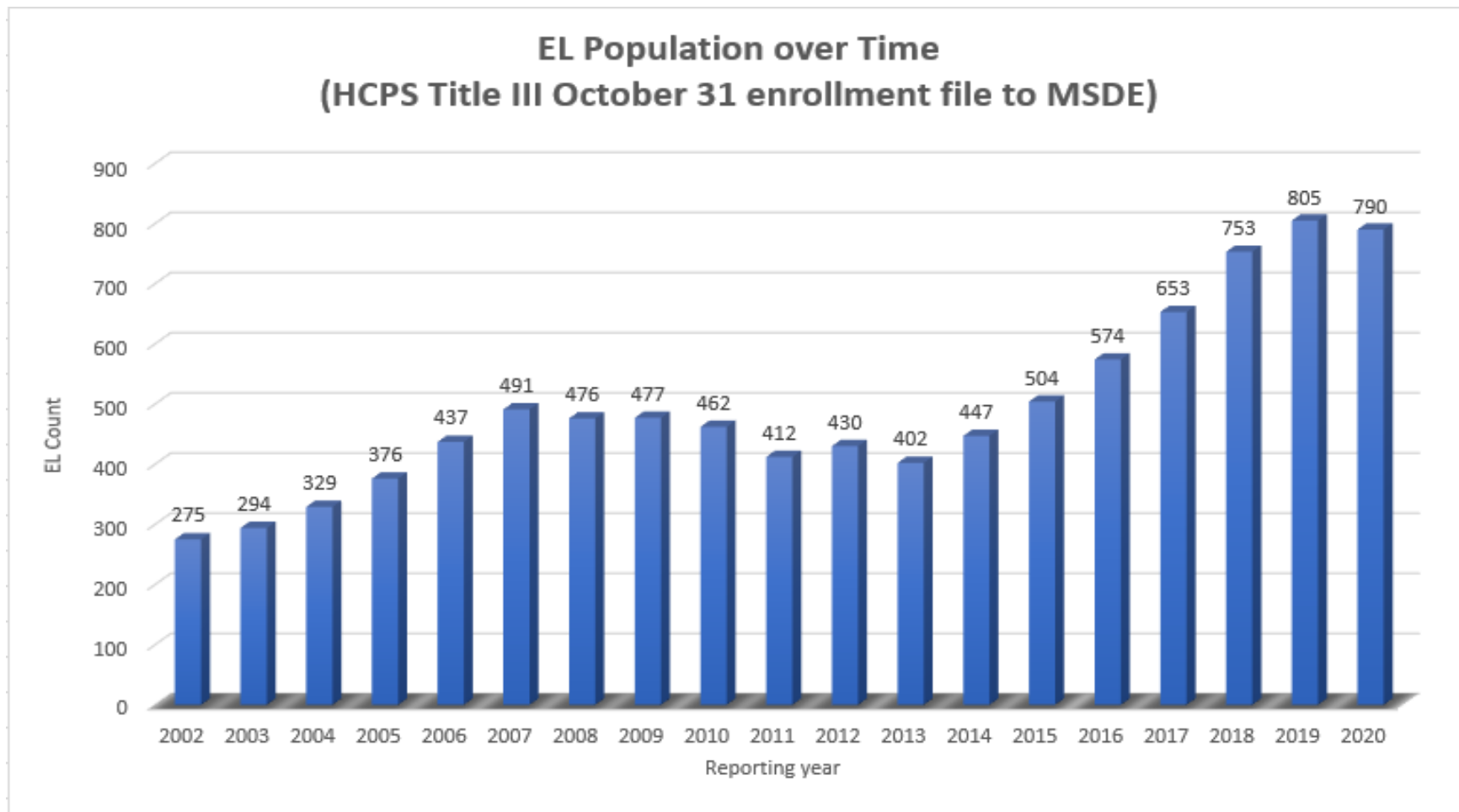

## Title III of ESSA – English Learners (ELs) Eligibility, Guidance, and Laws

- **An EL is a student** who may have been born outside of the U.S.:
  - who communicates in a language other than English; or
  - whose family uses a primary language other than English in the home; and
  - whose English language proficiency falls within the range established by the State for an English language development program.





# The Growing Number of English Learners (ELs) in HCPS





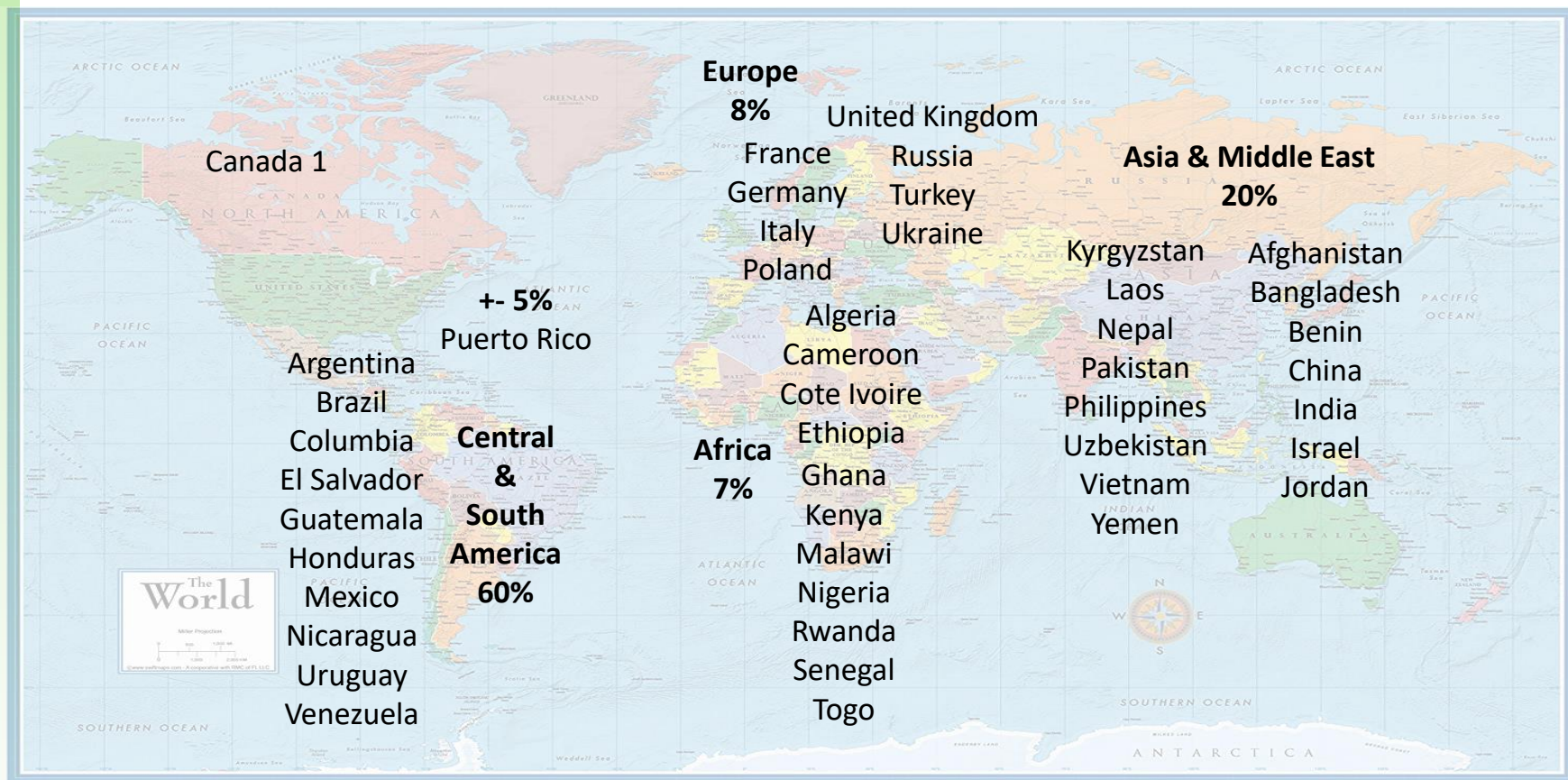
## Where HCPS English Learners come from:

*“Local school systems are required to ask the parents of **every student upon enrollment** if a language other than English is spoken using a **Home Language Survey (HLS)** to identify potential ELs”*



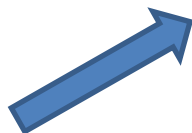

- Maryland Home Language Survey
- **English Language Placement Test** (WIDA Screener or W-APT)
  - Eligible for ESOL if the score is **below PL 4.5 (scale 1.0-6.0)**
- **Data requests for Transfer Students**
  - Previous WIDA scores determine eligibility for ESOL
- **Notification of Placement in ESOL**
  - Yes – Parents agree with ESOL services
  - No – Parents refuse ESOL services
- **EL Plan**
  - Indicates EL status, proficiency level (PL), and EL accommodations
- **ESOL Services**

# ELL Teacher role within school setting

- **Assessment** of students identified on the HCPS Registration Form and the Maryland Home Language Survey as those whose primary language spoken at home is other than English, and their **eligibility determination** for ESOL services,
- **Instruction** to eligible English learners and documentation of their progress in English language acquisition (WIDA scores and interpretation of scores),
- Role of an **education liaison/advocate** for English learners and their families and/or a cultural/linguistic facilitator within the school setting.

## Accessible technology

Teachers use a web browser or mobile app, families use text messages or a mobile app.



## No language barriers

Interact with any family member regardless of language – you write your message in English, families message back in their own language.



## Meaningful family engagement

In-app coaching and guidance for teachers and parents to support effective family engagement.

## Step by step flowchart

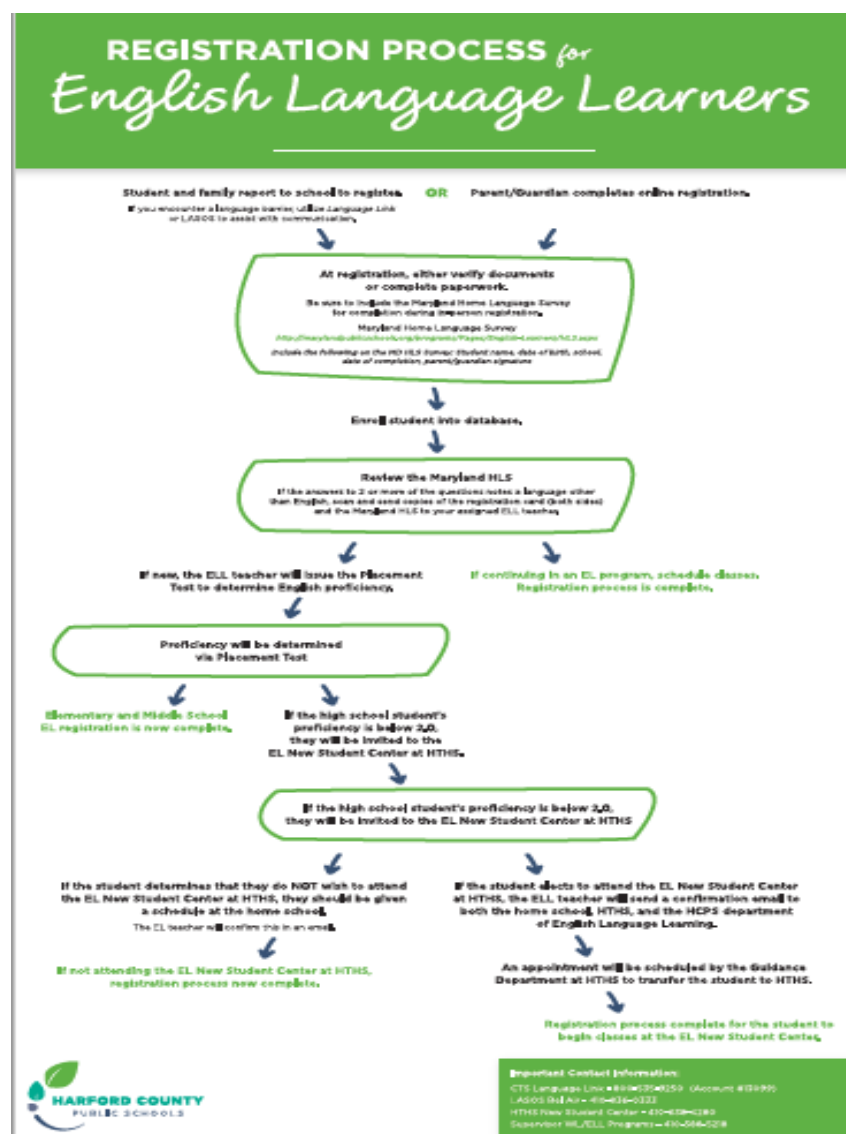

# ALL Schools

**Student and family report to school to register. OR Parent/Guardian completes online registration.**

If you encounter a language barrier, utilize *Language Link* or LASOS to assist with communication.



**At registration, either verify documents  
or complete paperwork.**

Be sure to include the Maryland Home Language Survey  
for completion during in-person registration.

## Maryland Home Language Survey

In accordance with federal and state requirements, the Home Language Survey will be administered to all students and **used only for determining whether a student needs English language support services** and will not be used for immigration matters or reported to immigration authorities.

If a language other than English is indicated on two or more of the three questions below, the student will be assessed for English language support services. Additional criteria for testing may be considered.

1. What language(s) did the student first learn to speak?
2. What language does the student use most often to communicate?
3. What language(s) are spoken in your home?

### With the Maryland HLS

One of the questions notes a language other than English. Provide two copies of the registration card (both sides) to your assigned ELL teacher.



If new, the ELL teacher will issue the Placement Test to determine English proficiency.



Proficiency will be determined via Placement Test



Elementary and Middle School EL registration is now complete.



If the high school student's proficiency is below 2.0, they will be invited to the EL New Student Center at HTHS.



If continuing in an EL program, schedule classes. Registration process is complete.



# For HS only

If the high school student's proficiency is below 2.0, they will be invited to the EL New Student Center at HTHS



If the student determines that they do NOT wish to attend the EL New Student Center at HTHS, they should be given a schedule at the home school.

The EL teacher will confirm this in an email.



If not attending the EL New Student Center at HTHS, registration process now complete.



If the student elects to attend the EL New Student Center at HTHS, the ELL teacher will send a confirmation email to both the home school, HTHS, and the HCPS department of English Language Learning.



An appointment will be scheduled by the Guidance Department at HTHS to transfer the student to HTHS.



Registration process complete for the student to begin classes at the EL New Student Center.
